Dredging

Dredging is the use of marine based equipment to excavate material from the bottom of the sea, lakes or rivers for the purpose of enabling navigation or for the recovery of the mined materials.

This a very specialized industry requiring investment in purpose built equipment of all sizes that is designed and constructed to meet a wide range of requirements.

Dredging resources are used to:

- Deepen and maintain waterways, shipping channels, and ports.
- Create and maintain (re-nourish) beaches.
- Excavate new harbors.
- Reclaim land.
- Restore aquatic and wetland habitats.
- Excavate pipeline, cable and tunnel trenches.
